We are delighted to announce the fourth Open House Cork weekend running from October 4th to October 6th, 2019.

Open House is a design festival which runs in 40 cities across the world, celebrating the best architecture each city has to offer. We are excited to hold this event in Cork for the fourth time and invite you to celebrate with us by taking part!

Our series of talks, tours and exhibitions held in buildings all over the city will showcase the rich and varying architecture of Cork. All of the events are completely free, and mostly available on a first come, first served basis.

How Does Open House Cork Work?

Open House Cork (OHC) invites all citizens to explore their city. It stems from one simple but powerful idea: showcasing outstanding architecture for everyone to experience. Buildings that aren't usually accessible to the public open their doors for one weekend only, with tours provided by expert guides. All OHC tours and events are completely free.

What to Expect

Each building and event is staffed with a number of helpful OHC guides who are happy to greet and assist you. Building tours are usually led by the architect or an individual very familiar with the building. They will share their knowledge and insight, but are keen to chat too and welcome your questions. Tours will generally last about 30 minutes.

Open House Building Tours

Unless otherwise stated, our building tours operate on a first come, first served basis. Just show up during the listed opening times and join the next available tour. This is a family friendly weekend, however children must be accompanied and supervised by an adult at all times. Note that a few buildings are not suitable for children for safety reasons. This is noted below the buildings' listings.

THE FRANK MURPHY TRAIL

Conor English, author of the forthcoming book *'Cork's Modern Architect, the work of Frank Murphy'*, will lead a series of events centered on the work of Cork's renowned Architect. A dedicated modernist and an equally progressive conservation campaigner, Murphy concentrated for much of his career on the 20th century ecclesiastical designs, schools, offices and factories of Cork.

Guided external tour of Frank Murphy's masterpiece, the Cork Distillers' Bottling Plant (1964), by Conor English. In 1960 Cork Distillers wanted to create an image of a modern company that had facilities to rival their then Dublin competitors. The project had an impressive pairing: an ambitious Cork client matched equally with a home grown determined architect. The building is distinctive for its riot of colour, Mosaics and cast sculptural concrete.
